### Catch the Vision, Share the Joy!!



#### Dear Friends.

Twenty years ago this month I was ordained into the Christian ministry. The service at First Reformed U.C.C. was filled with wonderful music and an excellent sermon by the Rev. Dr. Alfred Bartholomew. I co-celebrated communion with my former pastor, the Rev. Dana Schlegel (I

included the picture of us to this article). I was surrounded by family and friends from various stages of my life. So much has happened in my ministry since October 24, 2004.

I obviously think about the baptisms, funerals, weddings, and confirmations that I have experienced over the last 20 years! I think of my involvement in the wider church and the communities where I have served! I think about the mission and ministry that I have been involved with in the congregations I have served! However, I also think about how the Church has changed so much since I was ordained.

I am reminded that I began seminary about a week before the terrorist attacks on September 11. That tragic event caused people to attend worship in the weeks following, but it also caused us to not treat others that are different from us with respect. It was evident that the current events would impact the Church. This is ever true now! Just years after my ordination, we were in the midst of some economic hardships that caused congregations to make serious decisions about staff and ministries. These concerns have exacerbated in recent years as we experienced the challenges of the COVID pandemic.

My seminary education and the learning opportunities required for ordination could not prepare me for these challenges. I have realized time and time again that we learn how to confront these challenges through our experiences. As I reflect on 20 years in the ministry, I think about the joys and sorrows that I have experienced and how they have shaped me for ministry now and in the future.

We can't deny the fact that the Church is in the midst of challenging times right now! Human and financial resources have diminished. People aren't entering the ministry. The structures of the Church are rapidly crumbling and it seems that we no longer recognize the Church. For some reason, people have walked away from the Church and it is hard to get those left in the pews to be engaged in the life of the Church. What will be the future of the Church?

I have been pondering this question for several years now and I don't have all the answers. As I celebrate this milestone, I realize that this is the half-time mark of my pastoral career. I have another 20 years of ministry until I can retire. What congregations will be around in 20 years? What will ministry look like in the next 20 years?

As I said, I don't have the answers. What I do know is that God continues to call us to share the gospel of Jesus Christ to a broken world. I do know that God continues to call us to work with one another as we share in the cost and joy of discipleship. As I said 20 years ago, "I do, relying on God's grace. Will you join me?

### **CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS by Bob Kilgore**

**2025 BUDGET:** Denise reported we are in a strong financial position; increases in expenses are in line with building costs and staff salaries.

Food Hub donation - \$5, 000 recommended and approved by consistory; Money is for the renovation of the second floor to be use as a shelter.

The Consistory approved the projected 2025 budget and it will be presented at the congregational meeting on November 10.

Property Committee informed us that six of the AC units need to be replaced. They have a bid from J&J, but the Consistory would like to have at least one more bid to compare with J&J.

**CHURCH ORGANIST**: Music committee recommends Karen Karosas as new organist. Karen recently retired in the Philadelphia area as a social worker and has been serving as an organist since 1985 at various churches.

The Consistory voted unanimously to approve Karen as organist. She moved to Lancaster at the end of September and she is planning to start at Trinity at the beginning of November.

**LEE BOSSERT ESTATE FUNDS**: Pastor consulted with the family and recommended using the funds in three areas

- 1. Preschool Endowment—40%
- 2. Hunger Ministries Endowment—40%
- 3. Pastor Discretionary Fund—20%

#### **PASTOR VISIONING:**

- Leadership development workshop planned for October 12, led by Dr. Carrie Call
- 2. Interested in more collaborative work with preschool and Scouts; astronomy night is planned Dec. 5 with Sue Bowman
- A new small group for those grieving to continue in October or early November. He also suggested a small group to explore further VBS adult class regarding current American religious landscape
- Restructuring Pastor provided some possibilities for our consideration
- Pastor provided a handout on "How can a congregation change its culture?"

consistory Leadership For 2025: Nominating Committee reported that a few people have agreed to serve, but many people are declining. They will continue their work and have a report in October. Cherie will be stepping down as a Deacon and Consistory President. Jeff will be stepping down as an Elder and Consistory Vice President. 

For several years, members have been able to make weekly/recurring donations on-line in lieu of paying cash/checks or by mail. On-line donations save the cost of a check and envelope and if using the recurring feature, remembering weekly to prepare your envelope. Presently we have several individuals/families using on-line donations either weekly or recurring.

We believe that financial transparency builds trust and is a mark of stewardship so we want to take a moment to remind you that there is a small cost for this convenience. You'll have the opportunity to help cover the cost of processing when you give. Please know that this is 100% optional, but we appreciate your partnership in making your gift go as far as possible to impact our mission.

We have never asked our members to cover these costs especially since 2020 at the start of the pandemic. The costs are 1.05% when paying by check, 3.05% when paying by credit/debit card.





### UPDATED INFORMATION ABOUT THE TRIP TO WASHINGTON D.C.





### PASTOR CHRIS' 20TH ANNIVERSARY OF ORDINATION!



### Our Gifts to Others 2024 from the Board of Deacons


Each year Trinity UCC considers donations titled "Our Gifts to Others." These annual gifts serve to support various outreaches that are important to our friends who are in need throughout the area.


We have a number of outreach options from which we may choose. Here is a brief summary of those seeking your consideration and support.

- **Milagro House** is committed to providing education, counseling and housing for women and children experiencing homelessness here in Lancaster County.
- **Bethany Children's Home** started its *Helping Hands* program to provide unaccompanied children and youth the opportunity to be reunited with their families in the U.S. Youths stay an average of 10-12 days and receive basic medical care, food clothing shelter more development and basic education while their families are located.
- **Hoffman Homes Inc.** is a nonprofit that provides comprehensive psychiatric care, treatment, support, and education to youth and young adults and their families from across Pennsylvania. We inspire hope and brighter futures.
- Love, Inc. is a national agency that seeks to provide a conduit through which people in need can seek out much needed support efforts by local churches. This agency is geared for those among us in chronic need and seeks to transform lives in the community.
- Lancaster Theological Seminary educates men & women for here for a variety of ministry settings. Donations to LTS help to support students in need with tuition, housing, etc.
- **Phoebe Devitt** operates nursing home facilities here in central Pennsylvania. The ministries seek donations to help cover the cost of residents stay, regardless of their ability to pay.
- UCC Homes—provides benevolent care, and uncompensated care for needful seniors. This organization seeks our help to meet this need. There are homes in Ephrata, Annville, Carlisle, and Harrisburg.
- **Hunger Ministries** You can designate to support the Hempfield Power Packs, the Lancaster Food Hub, or the Trinity Community Meal ministry.




### EAST PETERSBURG PARADE PICTURES






