There are a lot of significant church related anniversaries to celebrate in 2025! I want to highlight these important milestones for you!

First, you will see some information in this newsletter about a special adult class that will

happen this month. The Rev. Dr. Charlie Hambrick-Stowe, my father-inlaw, will discuss the topic of religion and the American Revolution. As we prepare to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the Revolution, Charlie will share with us what this means for us today! I hope you will join us on February 2. 9. & 16 in Isenberg Hall.

Next, Lancaster Theological Seminary is celebrating their 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year. Please look in this newsletter for the flier with the various events Lancaster Seminary has planned for this celebration! The first event will be Seminary Sunday on February 23. We will lift up Trinity's longstanding relationship with Lancaster Seminary during both services that day. Some of our members who are graduates of Lancaster Seminary will assist with the 10:30 a.m. service. I encourage you to attend the other events listed on the flier!

This year is also the 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the German Reformed Church in the United States. The first communion service was held on October 15, 1725 at Falkner Swamp Church in Gilbertsville, PA. Since Trinity Church is rooted in the German Reformed Church, we will join other U.C.C. congregations in commemorating this anniversary with a special liturgy on October 12. There will also be a Festival Celebration on Wednesday, October 15 sponsored by the Pennsylvania conferences of the U.C.C. Stay tuned for more information!

Lastly, this year is the 1700<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Council of Nicaea. This Council met from May-July in the year 325. One of the major accomplishments of this ecumenical council was the formation of the Nicene Creed. The Christian Education Committee is interested in exploring the Council of Nicaea. Watch for more information!

I hope you will participate in the various activities, services, concerts, and learning opportunities planned for these significant celebrations. All of these milestones occurred before the founding of Trinity Church, but they have influenced who we have been and who we are now! Let us honor our heritage as we continue to move forward in faith!

#### **CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS by Bob Kilgore**

- --Treasurer's Report: Denise reported that the congregation has been generous with their financial support of the congregation. We have 72 days of liquidity. Trinity ended 2024 with a gain of \$4,728. The combined financials (congregation & preschool) ended 2024 with a gain of \$4,229.
- --Pastor's Report: Pastor Chris has been making connections with the new leadership of the AA group and the Scout troop, both groups that use Trinity's building for their meetings. He shared that we had some visitors at our Christmas Eve services, especially some young people at our late service who were looking for a traditional Christmas Eve service.
- --Approved Pastor Chris' suggestion of using the Education Ministry Fund to support the leadership seminar on February 1.
- --President Jeff Hackenberger will be contacting members to see if they will serve as the at-large member of the Audit Committee. Elder George DeLong and Deacon John Shelsky are the Consistory representatives to the committee.
- --Pastor Rankin reported that a representative from Traditions of America (TOA) in Lititz talked with him about using Trinity for an afternoon concert in May (during the week) with the Silver Sings Chorus (members come from the TOA communities in Lititz and East Petersburg). Consistory felt this would be a good way to connect with our neighbors at the TOA community in East Petersburg. Consistory approved the Silver Singers Chorus to use Isenberg Hall on May 16 or 17 for an hour-long concert. More information will be forthcoming.



# **Online Giving Information:** Contributing your donation using our website....trinityeastpete.org....RESOURCES, PAY ON LINE

For several years, members have been able to make weekly/recurring donations on-line in lieu of paying cash/checks or by mail. On-line donations save the cost of a check and envelope and if using the recurring feature, remembering weekly to prepare your envelope. Presently we have several individuals/families using on-line donations either weekly or recurring.

We believe that financial transparency builds trust and is a mark of stewardship so we want to take a moment to remind you that there is a small cost for this convenience. You'll have the opportunity to help cover the cost of processing when you give. Please know that this is 100% optional, but we appreciate your partnership in making your gift go as far as possible to impact our mission.

We have never asked our members to cover these costs especially since 2020 at the start of the pandemic. The costs are 1.05% when paying by check, 3.05% when paying by credit/debit card.

In 2022, we added a feature to our on-line giving whereby you can help to cover the costs of paying online by debit/credit card or checking account. This is entirely **OPTIONAL.** There will be a check-off block to use if you wish to cover your transaction cost in addition to your contribution.

#### TREASURE IN CLAY JARS by Rev. Jack Esbenshade

I consider it a privilege to be able to participate in the rite of healing that is held periodically at Trinity. As people come forward to be anointed, I place my thumb into a scented oil and then inscribe a cross on each person's forehead. I use a blessing - "As I anoint you, so may God fill you, with the powerful presence of the Holy Spirit."

And after everyone who wishes to be anointed has returned to their seats, Pastor Chris and I anoint each other. The rite includes words, visual cues and also the scent of the oil. It is a multi-sensory event. There is a certain staying power with the anointing. The aroma of the oil remains with me as I catch a whiff throughout the day

The scented oil enables me to recall the healing service but it also remains with me as a comforting reminder of the grace of God and the healing presence of the Holy Spirit.

Outward and visible signs like the oil of anointing or the bread and the cup are intended to offer us cues so that we might be aware and alert to God's love, grace and presence in our lives.

Our response as healed and accepted people is to be loving and gracious too. As we move into a new year, it is incumbent upon us to be aware of the ways in which God touches our lives. Equally important is our response of gratitude.

#### **Religion in the American Revolution**

Our nation begins its observance of the  $250^{\text{th}}$  anniversary of the War for Independence this year. Three February class sessions will look at the

complex role Christian faith and the various church traditions played in the struggle, along with the impact of the Revolution on religious life in the New Republic.

February 2 How religious experience set the stage for the Revolution Why the war was spiritually and theologically complicated Ways the Revolution changed religious life in America

Participants will be encouraged to reflect on ways the issues confronting Christians in the Revolution—from the start of the war in 1775 to ratification of the Constitution and Bill of Rights by 1791—are still with us in contemporary American society.

Charles Hambrick-Stowe is minister emeritus of the First Congregational Church of Ridgefield, Connecticut. Previously, he served as academic dean of Northern Seminary in Illinois, director of the Doctor of Ministry program at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary, and pastor at Church of the Apostles in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, and St. Paul's United Church of Christ in Westminster, Maryland. In addition to MA, and MDiv degrees, he holds a PhD in American Studies from Boston University. He is the author of numerous books and articles in the fields of American religious history and biblical studies.

#### **Prayers for Sierra Leone**

Heavenly Father, we come to you with open hearts and minds as we thank you for the blessing of community and all it does to help us, keep us, and grow us. We thank you for the joy the festive season has brought us. It has been a time to enjoy the company of loved ones, reflect on the mountaintops and valleys of the year, and celebrate your son Jesus' birth.

We also see the ways in which we have fallen short of your desire for our lives and your purpose. We pray that you baptize us in the way only the Holy Spirit can, in the way you told us in Luke 3, God. We pray that in your divine timing, issues like food security and energy access will start to improve. Under the current government, the import tax on rice alone has risen from 5% to 10%. Give Sierra Leone the resources it needs to see lasting change, and let those in power be good stewards of the responsibility given to them.

This and more is our prayer to you, Lord. We will forever give you glory and thanks for the continuous blessings you have poured into our lives. Amen.

#### Mission Moment from Sierra Leone

Music is a universal language that can transcend language and cultures. Through the programs of the Youth



Desk at the Council of Churches of Sierra Leone (CCSL), supported by Global Ministries, kids are able to express themselves and the problems they face through music.

In December, two inception meetings were held to carve out opportunities in the fine arts for the youth of Sierra Leone. One program is helping to teach the youth a new instrument of their choice. They are also learning to read music and get the opportunity to perform in bands and choirs at

events such as Youth Thanksgiving Church Services. This allows them to not only broaden their knowledge but also use their God-given gifts and talents to perform in God's house of worship.

The second inception meeting was about how the youth desk and music committee of CCSL can collaborate with an advocacy group from a village outside the province of Makeni, Sierra Leone. Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) is a common practice in Sierra Leone and is often believed to be a spiritual and social practice, but it actually puts women and girls at risk of short-term and long-term health problems. The advocacy group led by Pastor Emmanuel uses their voices and creativity to make songs and short plays about the issue to inform people how horrific and detrimental FGM is to the health of women and girls.

In the coming months, Pastor Emmanuel and the CCSL Youth Desk Music Team will be collaborating to hold conferences in the villages of Sierra Leone to inform people about how FGM affects women, how we can help combat it, and how integral government policies are to combat these issues. With all this work, the kids will be expressing this through the universal language of music—making songs and art to express their needs and desire for the safety of themselves and other women.




